CCC's new MSc in Cancer Care Successfully Launched Sept 21

The first of the CCC delivered modules, Fundamentals in Cancer Care and Developing Practice in Cancer Care, was launched on the 8th September – running for 7 consecutive weeks. The course is part of the MSc Programme in Cancer Care in conjunction with the University of Liverpool and delivered by CCC MacMillan Senior Lecturers via MS Teams. The feedback we received was very positive and encouraging. The modules can also be undertaken as Continuing Professional Development (CPD) - for further details visit our [website](#). Fundamentals in Cancer Care (CANC600) Level 6

This module is aimed at healthcare professionals who provide care for people with a cancer diagnosis within their care setting; who wish to develop their own practice in the holistic care of the person with cancer.

Fundamentals in SACT Administration & Cancer Care (CANC601) Level 6

Individuals presenting for systemic anticancer therapies (SACT) treatment have complex and diverse needs requiring a holistic approach to provide effective multi-disciplinary care. This is a practice module designed for registered nurses who are required to administer systemic anti-cancer treatment as part of their professional role.

Fundamentals in Palliative & End of Life Care (CANC602) Level 6

This module is aimed at Health Care professionals who provide care for people with a cancer diagnosis within their care setting; who wish to develop their critical understanding of palliative and end of life care of the person with cancer.

Developing Practice in Cancer Care (CANC700 Level 7)

This module is aimed at Health Care professionals who provide care for people with a cancer diagnosis within their care setting; whom wish to develop their own practice in the holistic care of the person with cancer.

Development Practice in SACT Administration & Care (CANC701) Level 7

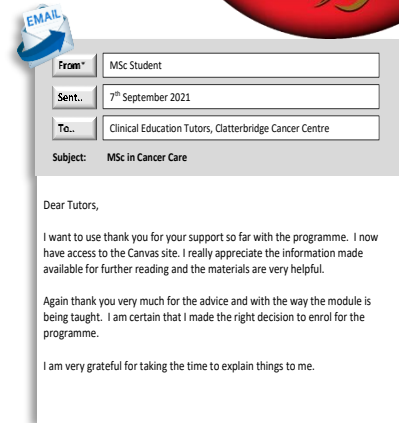
This module incorporates theoretical knowledge and clinical components that enable the learner to develop critical appraisal skills and clinical competencies associated with the administration of chemotherapy and systemic agents in solid and haematological tumours. Content and assessment align closely to the Systemic Anti-Cancer Therapy (SACT) Competency Passport, encompassing key safety principles.

Developing Practice in Palliative & end of Life Care (CANC702) Level 7

This module is aimed at Health Care professionals who provide care for people with a cancer diagnosis within their care setting; who wish to develop their critical understanding of palliative and end of life care of the person with cancer.

The Cancer Survivor (CANC703)

Developing practice supporting those living with the consequences of cancer and cancer treatment. This module is designed to encompass the survivorship phase of the cancer patient journey, enabling learners to critically explore the evidence base underpinning the management of late toxicity and associated impact on quality of life. It is relevant to a wide range of allied health and social care practitioners who have an interest in cancer survivorship.





Virtual Education for Acute Oncology Nurses & ANPS

Virtual education session aimed at the regional acute oncology (AO) Nurses and ANPs from within CCC commenced in September 2021, and have been very well received across the region.

News has travelled of the success and we also now have AO nurses joining us from Northern Ireland, one of the benefits of virtual session. The sessions have already covered a wide range of topics from expert speakers from CCC and externally, these include; palliative radiotherapy, acute kidney injury, frailty, Haematology, AO policy, Maggies, and palliative care.

Upcoming topics include;

- Governance
- Spot light on cancer manager
- Interventional radiology
- Sarcoma
- Patient experience

This is a real achievement. They have all shown great commitment and determination in their roles over the last two years.

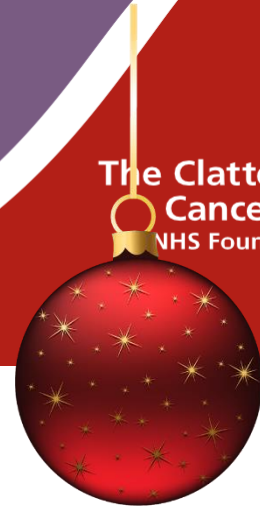
...AND A SPECIAL MENTION...

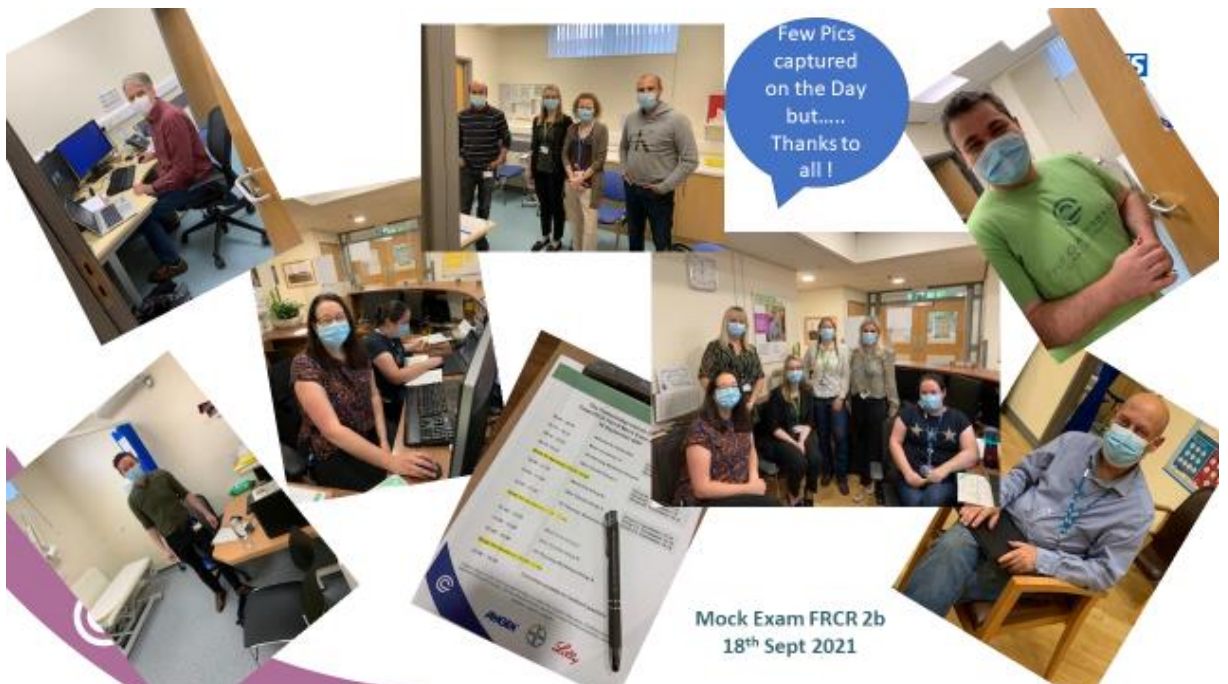
FRCR Part 2b Mock-Exam 18th September 2021

Calling All Nurses and AHPs How to Access your Continuous Professional Development Funding

£150 million has been made available from Health Education England (HEE) to enable employers to provide a £1,000 training budget for each NHS nurse, midwife and AHP within Trusts. This offer, over a 3 year period, started last year and many of you have already taken advantage of these funds to support your education and development. CCC's allocation of Funds for this year are now available and the Trust would like to encourage its Nurses and AHPs to apply for funding for relevant professional development, training and education courses. **So how do you access it?** The process is simple; all you have to do is apply through Study Leave.

Study Leave Committee Meeting Dates

A Committee sits every month to review all study leave applications on the second Tuesday. Following the meeting, you will be notified by email of the panel's decision and if approved, your chosen course will be funded directly with the course provider.

HSJ Awards 2021

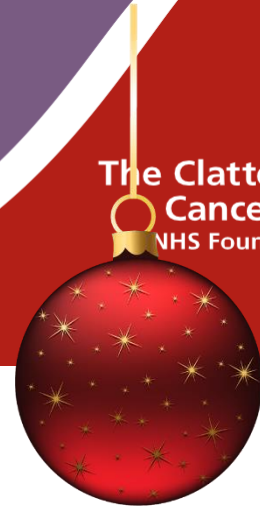

The aims of the role were to:

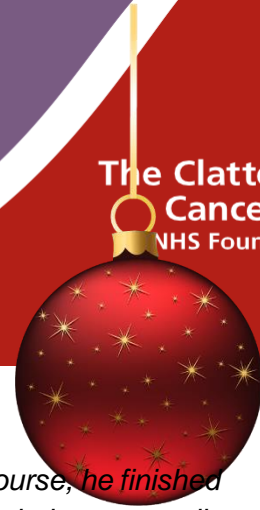
- Map progress of the implementation of RePAIR recommendations into practice across England
- Identify local and regional good practice, opportunities and challenges
- Develop a shared online live resource
- Understand the relevance of findings from RePAIR to new ways of working for training in oncology developed during the COVID-19 pandemic

This secondment has given me the opportunity to work with a wide range of stakeholders; radiotherapy managers, education leads, student Therapeutic Radiographers and also experience working with Health Education England and our professional body.

The outputs from the project include priority recommendations housed in a report to be published by HEE, publications, presentations and webinars and a Special Interest Group on the SoR website

This has now led to a second secondment with the SoR until the end of June, where I will be producing a professional body guidance documentation on the use of simulation in Radiotherapy education and training”.

Radiotherapy Education



Students

Radiotherapy staff have welcomed back all of our RT students this autumn. Numbers of students remain high in

Radiotherapy and our new intake for BSc will be the largest cohort to date with 16 first years, including 4 international students. This will bring the total number of Radiotherapy students that will train here over the next three years to 54 (39 BSc and 15 PostGraduate). Clatterbridge remains an exceedingly popular destination for students from The University of Liverpool and feedback is good from our students.

New starters

We also welcomed 4 new band 5 Therapeutic Radiographers into the department and happily one of our ex colleagues returned to us also, so the Education team have been supporting them all through their supernumerary period. We welcome Kirsty Hoole into the Education team too on a 12 month secondment.



Medical Students

The Education team have been collaboratively working with the University of Liverpool and Sarah Jones to accommodate an hour long practical session in the RT Simulation suite at the University for the medical students that spend a week at our Liverpool centre. In times past we could accommodate them on the treatment machines to observe Radiotherapy for an hour or two, but with our student numbers for both RT and Medics so high now this is simply not possible.

Accommodating up to 13 Medical students weekly in the suite, together with our colleague at the University Jenny Callender, the education team have facilitated this with great success. This will be the way that these students will learn about the clinical and planning side of Radiotherapy moving forward each year now.

CIED monitoring

The Education team were also part of a project to implement radiographer led cardiac implantable electronic device (CIED) monitoring for patients undergoing radiotherapy, and where put forward for the HSJ awards 2021. This has now been successfully implemented across the radiotherapy department.





Radiology News

Clinical Placement Expansion Programme

We continue to take part in the CPEP project for the 2021/2022 academic year. We will be taking on two more students from the Pre-Reg MSc course run by the University of Liverpool.

This is a brand new course at the University and hopes to be as successful as the Radiotherapy equivalent. The students will be placed with us over the summer months of 2022.

‘Grow our Own’ Radiologists

“I have joined CCC as the first Senior Clinical Fellow in Radiology. My background is predominantly in Nuclear Medicine (both diagnostic and therapeutic applications) in addition to Core Radiology. This new 12 month post is split across the Liverpool and Wirral sites and is primarily aimed at learning how to read cross sectional oncological studies (CT, MRI and PET/CT). The post also provides opportunities for MDT involvement in addition to project work within the field. Due to the nature of my prior training, my area of interest is Nuclear Medicine and PET/CT, however, I am especially keen to further my reporting experience of MRI and learn the intricate nuances that come with tertiary oncology work, including how to perform RECIST reporting. It is an exciting opportunity to join the Trust at a time when there is an increasing need for multimodality imaging and a changing dynamic of work with the opening of the Liverpool site and the increased acuity that has developed with the service changes. I am able to collaborate with different clinical teams and allied health care professionals who not only have been incredibly welcoming, but are also keen to share their own knowledge and experiences and support my training needs. The post has also provided the opportunity to teach the clinical and medical oncology trainees as part of their regional training programme. The development of this new post will hopefully further strengthen the imaging services offered at CCC and enable the wonderful radiology department that is already here to grow”

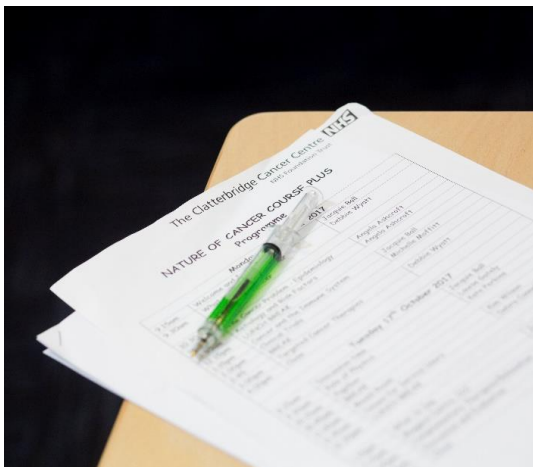
